

A queer-feminist-dis/ability meta-ethics of reproduction

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This presentation aims to give an overview of the current most crucial theoretical elements for a queer-feminist-dis/abled feminist ethics dealing with reproduction and arguing for a combination of an ethics focused on both, justice and ontology. The aim is to develop an ethics that does not function in a regulatory way but rather works against its instrumentalization for normative regimes.

Justice, universalism & intersectionality and the focus on ontology are the strings, which hold the components of this ethical knot together. The other components interdependence, capabilities and a transformative ethos containing assemblages and queerversity are necessary, because of collective agency and the specific group of people involved (queer, transgender, intersex, dis/abled and people of color or different ethnic backgrounds, migrants, etc.) and because of reproductive issues, which depend on the involvement and interaction of more people than just one human being and transform society in a long run.
