Review 2007/2008 – A Report on Fellowships and Events

During the academic year 2007/2008 the Institute for Advanced Studies on Science, Technology and Society (IAS-STS) in Graz was again a place for numerous scholars to undertake their research – mainly dissertations, habilitations and post-doc research – in an interdisciplinary atmosphere, and for a lot of events, dedicated to defend and discuss results with colleagues or to present them to the public.

Research Fellows and Visiting Scholars in 2007/2008
